

## 1. GOOD GOVERNANCE AND INTEGRITY

- It entails collective decision-making, accountability and transparency in running the affairs of the country

Government has endeavored to involve citizens in the development of Government policy and legislation. For instance, in 2018, citizens were consulted during the formulation of;

- The Industrial Policy,
- The Non-Governmental Organisations Policy,
- The Heritage and Conservation Policy.
- The National Health Insurance Act No. 2 Of 2018.

- Enhancing integrity in the public service - The Public Finance Management Act No. 1 of 2018** is now instrumental in enhancing transparency and accountability in the use of public funds.

- Civil society involvement in Good Governance-** Government continued providing a conducive environment for civil society to participate in the governance of the country.

- In 2018, **[150] one hundred and fifty** civil society organisations were registered, bringing the total number of active civil society organisations, working in various sectors of our country to **906**.

On the 15th of March 2019, H.E the President of the Republic of Zambia, Mr. Edgar C. Lungu addressed the National Assembly in accordance with article 9(2) of the Zambian Constitution, which demands that the President addresses the nation on the progress made towards application of national values found in article 8.

**10,542 FRUIT TREES**

- Afforestation and reforestation.**
- Conservation farming.**
- Promotion of **green energy** as well as safeguarding and improving our environment through effective waste management.
- In 2018, trees were planted on **3,951** hectares of land.
- 15,509 hectares of land** was allocated for the establishment of community forests in **5 sites** of Mpulungu District.
- 10,542** fruit trees were planted
- 24,854 exotic trees and 60,000 vetiver grass** were planted.
- Statutory Instrument No. 11 of 2018** was issued to enhance community participation in forest management. This has so far resulted in the **signing of 21 forest management agreements covering a total forest area of 32,730 hectares of land in Muchinga and North-Western Provinces.**
- A total of **267,000 farmers** have adopted conservation agricultural practices countrywide.

- Government has been undertaking research and development and has come up with drought resistant crop varieties and contribute to crop diversification. In this regard, a total of **13 new crop varieties** were released onto the market in 2018.
- Continuously **sensitize the citizenry on reducing, re-using and recycling of plastic products.**
- Government introduced a **partial ban on the use of plastics** through **Statutory Instrument No. 65 of 2018** on extended producer responsibility to enhance implementation of the Environmental Management Act No. 12 Of 2011.
- Enacted the **Solid Waste Regulation And Management Act No. 20 of 2018.** The implementation of this Act will improve the handling and disposal of solid waste.
- Sustainable development also requires that old and dilapidated infrastructure is either repaired or demolished and then **"built back better"**.



"Morality and Ethics are values that define who we, as a people, collectively believe to be right or wrong, these values may either be written or not written. As a country a lot of positive strides have been made towards improving **morality and ethics in the country especially in areas of gender-based violence, alcohol and substance abuse, defilements and teenage pregnancies** which have continued to rise in our country."

- To reduce the incidence of gender-based violence in the country, the Government embarked on a countrywide **awareness program against gender-based violence**. This robust awareness has resulted into increased reporting of cases from **21,504 in 2017 to 22,073 in 2018**.
- Government has so far offered **counselling and legal support to 8,682 victims of GBV**.
- To expedite the prosecution of GBV perpetrators, Government has continued to establish **one stop- fast track courts**. As at 2017 there were only two fast track courts in Lusaka and Kabwe but as at 2018 four more courts were established and are functional in Chipata, Ndola, Livingstone and Mongu.

CYBER SECURITY

- In order to curb alcohol and substance abuse Government with help of cooperating partners has undertaken 2,310 **sensitization programs in schools, work places and communities** to sensitise on the adverse **effects of alcohol abuse**.
- Government has undertaken sensitization measures, among **traditional and religious leaders, under this program 235 chiefs and 180 religious leaders from across the country have been sensitized on the dangers of alcohol and substance abuse**.
- In order to promote responsible use of electronic platforms such as social media, Government is in the process of enacting the **Cyber Security and Cyber Crimes Bill** and the **Data Protection Bill** has reached an advanced stage.

PROMOTE HONEST,

- Teenage pregnancies** have continued to be an issue of concern and in order to continue with sensitization programs which are aimed at **reducing teenage pregnancy and supporting the rights of girl's** Government with the help of other stakeholders will continue implementing the adolescent health strategy.
- 40 trainers of trainers have been trained, 504 peer educators have been identified and trained and 1,309,150 adolescents** were reached with health messages and various health services.
- In order to promote **morals and ethics at work places**, Government developed code of ethics to regulate the behavior of public service offices. This program has continued and more institutions have developed the code of ethics which promote **honest, loyalty and integrity**. So far 3100 officers from immigration and police, 1351 teachers and 5984 civil servants were sensitized as at end of 2018.

BRIDGE  
DIVIDE BETWEEN URBAN & RURAL AREAS

- To promote the dignity of workers, Government, in September 2018, **revised the minimum wage for domestic, shop and general workers**.
- In 2018, Government, through the **Street Children programme**, provided social support and **rehabilitation services to 1,350 street children consisting of 1,215 boys and 135 girls**.
- Two additional first level hospitals were completed in 2018 and are operational in Chipata and Nyimba. The construction of **14 health posts** was completed, bringing the total number to **289**.
- To promote equity in access to education, especially by girls from vulnerable households, Government is implementing the **"Keeping Girls in School"** programme. In 2018, a total of 16,162 girls were supported with school fees against a target of **14,000**.
- To bridge the digital divide between urban and rural areas, Government completed the construction of **623 communication towers** in unserved and under-served areas in 2018. Out of these towers, 338 are already functional.

LEGAL AID SERVICES ACROSS THE COUNTRY




ACCESS TO WATER

- 18 of the **25 new radio station licences approved** in 2018, were for the rural areas.
- In an effort to improve access to legal representation, a total of **4,509 vulnerable people who sought assistance were all supported with legal aid services** across the country in 2018.
- To strengthen the policy framework for the provision of legal aid services, government, in November 2018, **launched the National Legal Aid Policy**.
- 1,077 boreholes were constructed in rural areas across the country in 2018. **Approximately 269,250 individuals are now able to access clean and safe water** from these boreholes.
- In 2018, Government **connected 36 rural growth centres in nine districts in five provinces** to the national grid through the **Rural Electrification Programme**. In total, 2,497 customers were connected to the national grid.



TEACHER RECRUITMENT

- To enhance **access to land**, Government has continued to implement the deliberate policy to allocate 40 percent of available land to women whilst the remaining 60 percent is competed for by both men and women.
- For instance, in 2018, 3,010 **certificates of title** were processed for women compared to 7,063 for men in an effort to reach the 40 percent target. This clearly demonstrates that we are making considerable progress towards **empowering women**.
- In our quest to eliminate all forms of discrimination in the delivery of development, government, through the **teacher recruitment exercise of 2018, reserved ten per cent of the total number of positions for persons with disabilities**.

## 7. MONITORING PROGRESS



A national framework to assist in gathering evidence in the application of national values and principles at national, organisational, community and individual levels has been developed. The National Framework provides a coordination mechanism among various institutions to facilitate comprehensive reporting and tracking of progress on the application of the national values and principles
